OUTLINE GUIDE

- BREAKFAST (at least 2 options)
- MORNING ACTIVITIES (2 options – 1 should be more active than the other)
- LUNCH (at least 2 options)
- AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES (2 options – 1 should be more active than the other)
- DINNER (at least 2 options)

- EVENING ACTIVITIES

Other things you might consider:

- Attractions and activities that are close to each other or that allow travel time are the best options.
- Good places to take photos that are in the area of your activities or meals
- Best places to park or nearest public transportation options
- Places to stop and get snacks – ice cream stand, coffee shop, etc.
- Addresses and phone numbers of restaurants and attractions mentioned
- Souvenir shops, book stores, boutiques, or any unique shops that might be in the area of your tour.
- The reference list should include the street addresses and phone numbers of the places you recommend.
- It's okay to express your favorite things – food at a restaurant, park, street, etc. People like to get an insider's impression. You could also reference your parent's choices, etc. like "my mom really enjoys the steak at this restaurant or my little brother loves to play on the swings at this playground."
- Double check things like "do the attractions charge an admission fee?" We won't use the dollar amount because it will likely change. But if something requires money we need to include that fact.
- Ask your parents and/or teacher to proof read your work.
